#### A Successful Eventing Season

While on-field results were mixed, off the field, the Varsity Cup season was a major success. Across our six home games, we filled an average of 70% of the Danie Craven Stadium (3 full stadiums) —highlighting the enduring pull of university rugby in Stellenbosch. The newly-introduced vendor village and fan walk were well received, creating a festive and engaging match-day atmosphere that enhanced the spectator experience. #### **WP League: An Honest** Assessment...

Since the end of the Varsity Cup, our results in the Western Province League have not met expectations. The senior 1st team has only managed one win from five - a performance that does not reflect the standards we set for ourselves. The U20s have shown moments of promise (three wins, one draw, one loss), but inconsistency remains a concern.

There are positives, however. Both our Victorians and Craven teams remain unbeaten, and the Markotter team, made up of committed ex-students, has returned to competition and impressed with five wins from six. These squads continue to build pressure for places and contribute to the wider health of the club.
